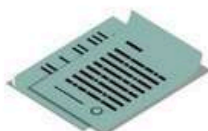

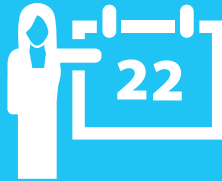


Encouraging Scholarship is being offered to currently enrolled students in good standing in a semester of the academic year.

## KEY TERM DATES

### Enrollment Date

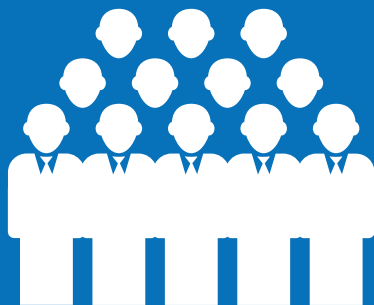
